What is a Buffer?

A buffer is a strip of undisturbed native vegetation at the edge of a lake, stream, or wetland. These buffer strips help to protect these natural water resources from erosion, runoff, and associated pollution. This is done by filtering the water and soaking it into plant roots and/or the groundwater system.

- Lakeshore restorations (full or partial shoreline)
- Streambank Restorations
- Buffer Plantings (for runoff management)

What are the benefits of shoreland restoration?

Shoreland restoration has many benefits, including:

- Controlling shoreline erosion,
- Protecting lakes by filtering runoff,
- Providing habitat for wildlife,
- Detering geese,
- Providing privacy,
- And reducing long-term maintainence.

Why is this Important?

- Shoreline restorations are important because so many people around the lake are losing their shoreline due to mowing. Native vegetation can help to prevent erosion and keep our shorelines where they

How much funding is available?

The District will supply 50% of your funds up to \$1,200 on a reimbursement basis.

These funds can be used for material costs such as: plants, erosion control, mulch and stakes.

How to apply

If you're interested in the program, please contact the District for an application. When you apply, we will need: a restoration plan, a species list, and a breakdown of cost and materials. Applications are accepted throughout the year until available funds are exhausted.
